IELTS SKILLS FOCUS

WRITING TASK 1 - PROCESS DIAGRAMS

It's important to master the different approaches required for each type of Writing Task 1 question. This month, we're focusing on Process Diagrams.

When writing your overview, think carefully about how best to group the steps in the process. A useful tip: if you can't easily label the groups you've created, it may be worth reorganising how you divide the steps.

Your paragraph structure should be based on this grouping. For example, if a recycling process can be divided into three main stages—sorting materials, breaking them down for reuse, and transferring them to factories—then your body paragraphs should clearly reflect those stages.

You also need to consider whether the process is man-made or natural. For man-made processes, use the passive voice (e.g. the bottles are collected) to focus on the actions and outcomes rather than the people involved. For natural processes, such as the life cycle of a salmon, the active voice is more appropriate (e.g. the salmon lays its eggs). In both cases, use the present simple tense throughout your response.

To help sequence your ideas, use clear linking language such as 'to begin with,' 'then, subsequently,' or more advanced phrases like 'once this stage has been completed....'

Keeping these points in mind will help you write a clear, well-organised, and high-level description of a process.

TECH TOOLS FOR IELTS

USING CHATGPT FOR SPEAKING SKILLS

1. Simulate the Test

Ask ChatGPT to act as an IELTS examiner and practise the different parts of the speaking test.

Try this: "Can you ask me 5 Part 1 questions on the topic of studying history and leave 30 second gaps for me to give the answers?"

2. Get Feedback

Use the microphone option on the phone's keyboard and then paste in your answers into ChatGPT, and then get specific feedback.

Try this: "Can you review my answer and point out the two main types of grammar mistakes and 8 collocations I could add to my answer?"

3. Practise Expanding Ideas

Train with follow-up questions to improve depth and coherence. Try this: "Ask me a Part 3 question and challenge me to give more detail."

Tip: Use ChatGPT as your daily speaking partner for just 5–10 minutes a day!
